WELCOME!

Welcome to the Village of Hussar! We are so pleased that you chose to join our small community!

The Village is located in Wheatland County and has a population of approximately 190 residents. We have a strong community spirit and our volunteers and community groups are an important part of our history and who we are today.

This package has been prepared to help assist you as you move into your new home. It is by no means complete, but it is meant to provide some general information, helpful hints and provide direction to resources. We encourage you to contact the Village Office for more information and resources.

HISTORY

The Hussar area was original part of the Treaty 7 lands, specifically the Siksika Nation (now located south of Gleichen). The area was first settled in the early 1900's, mostly by ranchers, and by 1910 farmers had begun to arrive.

Hussar was named by a group of German settlers, mostly officers in the German Army, who bought land in the area in 1910. However, when World War I broke out these settlers left to join the German war effort but were held in Prison of War Camps until the war ended. None of these settlers returned.

The C.P.R. line was built in 1911 and trains first came through Hussar shortly after. With the construction of the line the businesses in Hussar also began to pop up. Grocery stores, hardware stores, machinery dealership, and of course grain elevators. The rail line has since been removed, but Hussar continues to remember its rich history when it once had six elevators (one of which is privately owned and still stands).

The Village of Hussar was incorporated as a municipality on April 20, 1928.

GOVERNANCE

The Village of Hussar is governed by a three member council which is elected every four years. The head of council is the Mayor, who is selected annually from the councillors. Councillors sit on a number of regional boards and committees with which the Village partners to provide services more efficiently to our residents. The head of administration is the Chief Administrative Officer.

1. When are you open?

3. How can I pay my bills?

We accept cash, cheque or e-transfer. (No debit or credit cards). To discuss monthly payment options or to make a payment by e-transfer, contact the Village Office.

COUNCIL

1. How can I contact my councillors (including the Mayor)?

Contact information for councillors is on the Village website. Otherwise, you can leave a message at the Village Office and it will be forwarded to Council.

2. When are council meetings?

Council meetings are currently held the second Thursday of each month at 7:00 pm at the Village Office. On occasion, when there is no pressing business a council meeting may be cancelled. Please contact the Village Office to verify council meeting dates.

3. Can I speak at a council meeting?

Yes! Please contact the Village Office at least one week before the council meeting that you would like to speak at and we will put you on the agenda as a delegation. (Council has no requirement to let you speak unless you are placed on the agenda or it is a public hearing).

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

1. Do I have to purchase a license for my dog?

Yes. In fact, we require licenses for both dogs and cats. This is to protect the animal in the event that it is picked up as a stray by a bylaw enforcement or peace officer.

2. How many licensed animals can I have?

You are allowed to have up to two licensed animals. The third is required to be approved by Council.

3. How much does a license cost?

Licenses are based on whether your animal is spayed/neutered, as well as how many animals you have as follows:

Annual License Fee Spayed/Neutered Animal (First 2 Animals)	\$15.00/each
Annual License Fee Unaltered Animal (First 2 Animals	\$30.00/each

Annual License Fee Third Animal (Spayed/Neutered)	\$60.00	
Annual License Fee Third Animal (Unaltered)	\$100.00	
Annual License Fee for Transitional Animal (Spayed/Neutered)\$200.00		
Annual License Fee for Transitional Animal (Unaltered)	\$250.00	

4. I have a complaint against my neighbour, who do I talk to?

Please contact the Village Office. Depending on the time of complaint it may be dealt with by the CAO, Council or a Peace Officer. You may be required to fill out an official complaint form.

WATER/SEWER

1. How do I set up my utility account with the Village?

Please contact the Village Office to set up your account. We will require you to provide your updated mailing address. Utility accounts are billed to homeowners only (we do not bill to renters unless at the written request of the property owner).

2. What about other utilities (power, gas, telephone, etc.)

You can choose any service provider that you wish. There are many options available and we suggest that you speak to other residents or utilize other ways to research which company will meet your needs.

GARBAGE

1. What day is garbage pickup?

Garbage collection is on Wednesday mornings. Garbage should be out by 8:00 a.m.

2. Where do I put my bags?

In the summer time we ask that bags are put in the back alley (unless you do not have an alley), preferably in a container that has a cover to keep animals out. (If animals tear apart bags they will not be picked up and it is the responsibility of the resident to re-bag the garbage).

In the winter we will still attempt to pick up bags in the alleys, however if there is a snowfall that blocks the alley, your bag will need to be put in the front. (If your bags are in a covered container in the alley you may choose to leave them until the next week's pickup.)

3. How many bags can I put out?

Our bylaw states that only three bags may be put out each week with a 30lb limit, however, it is up to the we often will pick-up more than three bags as long as we have room on the trailer (it is up to the Public Works Foreman to determine whether more than three bags will be picked up).

4. What if I have too many garbage bags or large items?

All residents may take garbage out to the Transfer Site (located south of the Village) at no cost. The Transfer Site is currently open Monday, Wednesday and Saturday 9:00 am - 5:00 pm. You may also use the Drumheller Landfill and pay resident fees.

DEVELOPMENT

1. I want to build a shed/garage/deck or put an addition on my house, do I need a permit?

Contact the Village Office. While there are some projects that do not require permits, most do.

We will help you determine what types of permits you need to have (development, building, electrical, etc.), as well as direct you to where you can get more information.

	The plan runs from January to December of each tax year and continues each year unless cancelled, applicants do not need to enrol each year.
2.	Monthly payment amounts for January to June are calculated on the previous year's taxes. July to December payment amounts are calculated on the current years taxes remaining unpaid on July 1^{st} .
3.	It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that one payment is made each month of the year for the correct amount.
4.	Should the applicant need to postpone a payment, they must notify the Village Office before the last day of the month for which the payment is missed.
5.	If the applicant misses three consecutive payments the Village will remove the applicant from the plan and penalties will be calculated on the outstanding amount on July 31^{st} and December 31^{st} .
6.	Penalties will not be calculated on July $31^{\rm st}$ so long as the applicant remains in good standing with the plan.
7.	Penalties will be calculated on all outstanding taxes on December 31st.

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Animal License Registration

The Village of Hussar Annual Animal License fees is:

- > \$15.00 for each of the first two spayed or neutered animal(s)
- > \$30.00 for each of the first two unaltered animal(s)
- > \$60.00 for third animal spayed or neutered animal (application must be approved by the Village prior)
- > \$100.00 for the third unaltered animal (application must be approved by the Village prior)
- \$200.00 Transitional Animal Forth Animal Spayed/Neutered (application must be approved by the Village prior)
- \$250.00 Transitional Animal Forth Animal Unaltered (application must be approved by the Village prior)

All Dogs and Cats (whether indoor or outdoor) are subject to the provisions of the Animal Control Bylaw #555-24 and must be registered with the Village of Hussar

Licenses may be purchased at the Village of Hussar Office or by filling out this form and sending by mail or email, along with payment. The numbered dog tag you receive for each license will be valid for the lifetime of the animal as long as the license is renewed annually between January 1-31st each year. Should a tag be lost or stolen, please notify the Village Office immediately to cancel the tag – a replacement will be re-issued for free.

Village of Hussar Animal Control Bylaw #555-24

- 4.1 An owner shall keep within the boundaries of the Village no more than two (2) licensable animals unless:
 - 4.1.1 The owner has applied to the Village to keep additional animals. The total number of licensable animals does not exceed three (3) per household.
- 4.4 An owner whose animal is at large is guilty of an offense.
- 4.5 An owner whose animal incessantly barks, howls or makes any other noise which thereby disturbs the quiet or repose of any person is guilty of an offense.
- 4.7 An owner who allows an animal to deposit body waste on any property other than that which the owner is the lawful owner is guilty of an offense.
